This clinic will provide opportunities for research into the role of naturopathy in endometriosis. All research will be conducted under the governance of the Human Research and Ethics Committee.								
OTHER								
The committee noted that it will be important to manage patient expectations of a naturopathic service and that clear information outlining the scope and nature of the services provided and the role of other health professionals (eg gynaecologist, GP, pharmacist) should be available to patients attending the clinic. The applicants have stipulated that the naturopath will not initiate discussions about naturopathic medication, however it is anticipated that patients may bring this up. In this situation the naturopath will advise that there is no evidence for safety or								
effectiveness.								
If patients wish to use alternative therapies, potential drug interactions should be discussed with the treating doctor. Education of the naturopath regarding potential drug interactions to be addressed by the Department Head or Program Director.
